The mighty defender of the nest! The smasher of pigs! The castlebusting wrecking ball!"Red AlertRed is the main protagonist of the Angry Birds series and typically the central character in the games. Natural leader and grumpy to the extreme. He hates the pigs the most. Adaptational Angst Upgrade: While he has no backstory whatsoever in the games, The Angry Birds Movie gives him one on what he was like before the arrival of the pigs — he was one of the few birds in a peaceful island community who had a Hair-Trigger Temper, and the other birds (except for some) shunned him for it. Adaptational Jerkass: While he's mostly the same ol' grumpy bird, the movie continuity portrays him as a miserable loner who doesn't like to stick around with the other birds to hide his insecurities. Adapted Out: While still caring about the eggs, he's not their active guardian in the other adaptations such as in the movies. Berserk Button: Don't steal the eggs if you don't want him flying after your hide. While this trait also applies to other birds as well, he's way more aggressive compared to them. Due to aforementioned reason above, sometimes even a sight of the pigs alone can cause him to lose it. Big Ol' Eyebrows: Sports impressive ones. He was bullied for it when he was younger. Black Sheep: In The Angry Birds Movie as an angry bird in a community of happy birds. Character Blog: In 2021, he took over the Angry Birds Twitter account and made it to his image. Colour-Coded Emotions: His body is colored red, which represents anger. He's also the biggest Papa Wolf of the flock, so he's often angry. Dark and Troubled Past: Due to Adaptational Angst Upgrade above in the The Angry Birds Movie, this is the reason why he's always so grumpy. A Day in the Limelight: The "Red's Mighty Feathers" episode of the first game focuses on Red, giving him the special ability to dash towards any point in the level while in the air. Deadpan Snarker: He's this to a young chick who was disturbing his sleep by kicking a soccer ball against his house — he comes outside, smiles at him...then punts him into the ocean. Easter Egg: If you tap the screen after you launch him, he'll make a battle cry. In 2, this becomes his ability. Empowered Badass Normal: In the "Red's Mighty Feathers" episode of the first game, he is given some magic feathers from the Mighty Eagle, giving him the ability to fly straight in the direction the screen is tapped. Fiery Redhead: He's a red bird who's constantly angry at the pigs for stealing his eggs. Good Is Not Nice: In the movie, he has no intention of doing anything friendly, but he's still a good-hearted bird who's just edgier than the other birds. Good Is Not Soft: Most of the flock qualifies due to their Hair-Trigger Temper, but Red is portrayed as both the most violent and the most protective bird in the Toons series. Hair-Trigger Temper: In The Angry Birds Movie, he is depicted as having this, which turned him into an outcast in a peaceful island bird community. The Hero: The main protagonist of the Angry Birds series. He's classed as a Knight in Angry Birds Epic. It should be noted that, in the Transformers game, he plays Optimus freakin' Prime. Hot-Blooded: In the movie, he admits that he's a "passionate" bird. Jerk with a Heart of Gold: As the leader of the flock, Red is easily the grumpiest bird and is sometimes a bit of control freak toward the other birds, especially when it comes to protecting the eggs. With that being said, he does care for them in the end. In the movie, he is easily irritated, snarky, grumpy and anti-social, but he has a good heart and is willing to help his island out at the end. The Leader: Is this in all incarnations. Typically leans on the headstrong type, though he has shown elements of levelheadedness and mastermind when strategizing how best to attack the pigs. A Lizard Named "Liz": A red bird named Red. Make Me Wanna Shout: In "Angry Birds 2", he gains the special abilities, and is of average weight. This makes him usually the least useful bird for almost all

Birds Stella series due to being recently hatched at the end of the first movie after Red saved their eggs. Bratty Half-Pint: Let's just say that
they have quite a rather rebellious nature on occasion. Brilliant, but Lazy: They usually spend their free time napping or goofing off, but can clear the obstacle course Chuck set up better than he could, and can beat down pigs as much as the adult birds when they have to. their own show, Angry Birds Blues. Decomposite Character: A strange example—early on in the series, only one member of the Blues was ever seen at a time, implying they were a single bird who could split into three. Later on, it was clarified that they were three separate individuals who simply clung to each other in mid-flight. Genius Ditz: They're
much more goofy and playful than the other birds due to being the youngest, but they also come up with the most creative ways of defeating the pigs in the cartoon. Kid Appeal Characters: A trio of hotheaded ankle biters. Inexplicably Identical Individuals: They looked exactly the same, down to their very personality. The movie subverted this by
having different eye-colors for each Blue. The Lancers: In most of their game appearances. Justified that in earlier games, they even play the role of Prowl, who is also a second-in-command of the Generation 1 Autobots. Downplayed in Angry Birds Toons
where they function as Tagalong Kids. The Prankster: They love to pull out pranks towards the pigs, and even to the other two following Theme Twin Naming. Same-Sex Triplets: They're triplets, and they're all male. Sibling Team: Whenever they confront
the pigs, they always fight as a trio, never single. Spread Shot: Launched as a single bird that splits into three when the screen is tapped. Theme Twin Naming: Theme Triplet Naming: Jay, Jake and Jim. Totem Pole Trench: In Angry Birds to
meet! Let's see if we can't speed things up a little bit!"Fast & FuriousChuck is the deuteragonist of the Angry Birds series. His special ability basically makes him a super fast canary that can ignore the laws of physics. Adaptational Nice Guy: His rude and egotistical tendencies are greatly downplayed in the movie continuity. Ambiguously Bi: In the
movie, Chuck has an obvious gay crush on the Mighty Eagle (to the point of having an Imagine Spot where the Eagle is twerking in a Village People-like cowboy outfit before signing Chuck's bare chest) but, after the piggies steal the eggs, he is quick to suggestively suggest that the female birds should mate with him to replace the stolen eggs. Black
Mage: Classed as a wizard in Angry Birds Epic. Butt-Monkey: Chuck's smugness and happy-go-lucky overconfidence often land him in awkward and (sometimes, other birds would say this when idle. Expy: In his Space incarnation, he is wearing a red
visor, apparently a tribute either to Cyclops or a Cylon Centurion. Fragile Speedster: His ability makes him the fastest bird, but a glancing touch on an obstacle before he gets where you want him and he's wasted. Gravity Sucks: His ability also zigzags the trope in Space. Gravity affects him as long as he's just flying or after he hits something, but his
speed boost makes him immune to gravity. Hot-Blooded: Not as much as Red or Bomb, but he's very loud and hyperactive, and quite passionate about sports. Jerkass: In the animated shorts, Chuck is often depicted as a smug, selfish and arrogant egomaniac which sometimes bites him in the end. This trait seems to be downplayed in the movie
however. Jerk with a Heart of Gold: Despite his flaws, he genuinely cares about his friends and the safety of the early games to the early games. Keet: In the movie, he is always cheerful and enthusiastic. The Lancer: Often serves this to Red from Angry Birds Toons onward. Masculine Girl, Feminine Boy: The Feminine Boy to Matilda's Masculine Girl, at least in the early games
Meaningful Name: Chuck works best against wood. Hence, "woodchuck" Or alternatively, his speed increase is akin to "chucking", a term for throwing something at a fast speed. cheerful, friendly and the resident jokester. Pride: Chuck has quite an ego as he loves to show off his speed & skills which is associated with his Jerkass behavior and always full of himself. With that being said, he still a good guy who cares about his friends and willing to help whenever it need. Roboteching: He can do this in Space. Sensitive Guy and
Manly Man: The Sensitive Fowl to Red's Manly Bird, being more hyperactive and emotional than the more serious red. Smug Snake: Chuck's special ability is to speed up to up to 100 miles per hour
(160.934 kilometers per hour). In both the Angry Birds Toons and film, he's fast enough to enter "Chuck Time". Time Master: In Angry Birds Toons, he has a headband that allows him to slow down time. So far it has only appeared in three episodes: "Chuck Time", "Thunder Chuck", and "The Bird Who Cried Pig". This ability may be a reference to Kirin
Ranger. He has the ability to briefly slow time for the other racers in Angry Birds Go!, making him one of the most useful characters in the game. For other racers, this has the appearance of him blasting across the track at hyper speed. Vitriolic Best Buds: He has a rivalry with Bomb due to his ego, but they still care about each other at the end of the
day. In the movie, the two are depicted as Those Two Guys instead. Bomb "I will wipe that grin off their stupid faces or my name isn't... ... Sociable and exciting, he loves being the center of attention and entertaining people with his
antics. Action Bomb: Bomb's main ability is to blow himself up, devastating pigs and structures around him. Badass Baritone: He has a very deep voice in Toons. Big Fun: He's the biggest bird in the flock (after Terence), and also the guy you can count on if you want to have a good time. This is the very reason The Blues idolized him as they always
look up to him. The Big Guy: Whenever Terence is not around. Blessed with Suck: As powerful and cool his explosion power is, Bomb can't quite control it properly as he tends to randomly explode depending on his mood or when he surprised. Boisterous Bruiser: In the animated series, he's probably one of the most enthusiastic birds. Cartoon Bomb
His design is meant to invoke this trope. Dark Is Not Evil: Despite being a black bird, he's one of the playable heroes. Early Installment Weirdness: In his early appearance, he has a white dot on his forehead until it removed in the later games, including later versions of the original. 11th-Hour Superpower: In the "Short Fuse" episode of the first games
which is the final numbered episode, he gains a powerful electrical upgrade to his bomb blast. Emotional Powers: His explosive ability tied with his emotions. Thus, Bomb tends to explode depending on the mood he's currently in without his control, espectially anger. Everyone Has Standards: Despite his hatred for pigs, he stands up for a minion pig
when the other pigs bully him in this anti-bullying video. Gentle Giant: In the movie. He is the biggest member of the main cast barring Terence, but likely the nicest. Glass Cannon: Whenever he hits something, he will explode in a few seconds. You can also make him explode manually by tapping the screen. Because he's a bomb in bird form, whatever is in range gets blown up, too.
Trademark Favorite Food: He often seen eating ice cream to cool himself off. Vitriolic Best Buds: He has a rivalry with Chuck due to his short temper, but they still care about each other at the end of the day. In the movie, the two are depicted as Those Two Guys instead. Matilda "IMashed vegetables, feel it in your beak!" Matilda Fights for
PeaceMatilda (also known as the White Bird, Egg Beater Bird or Egg Bomber Bird, is the secondary tritagonist in the Angry Birds series. The leader of the Anger Management Class on Bird Island, a very kind and motherly chicken. Adaptational Superpower Change: In the games, she lays exploding eggs; in the movie, she shoots fireballs out
of her butt. Ambiguous Gender: Some fans had been mistaking her as a male. Averted with her Toons design which gave her Tertiary Sexual Characteristics to make her unambiguously female, which was carried over to the games starting with Angry Birds Go!. Berserk Button: "Cordon Bleugh!" reveals that she does not like having her cooking
mocked or ridiculed. When a bunch of pigs who just tried to steal the eggs taste her soup and make no effort to hide how much they love it, Matilda is so overjoyed to see someone enjoying her cooking that she decides not to give them the beating she was about to unleash and simply bounces away happily. Beware the Nice Ones: Matilda is the
Technical Pacifist of the flock and one of the nicer bird, even the pigs seems to like her on occasion. That said, when being provoked, she's outright terrifying to the point of scaring other birds sometimes, including Red. Blush Sticker: Sports really noticeable ones. The Bus Came Back: Reincarnated as C-3PO in the Star Wars installment of the series
She has appeared in most games since. Characterization Marches On: In Angry Birds Toons, she appears more feminine than her original masculine image. The Chick: She is the only female of the first main flock, being very motherly and making it her business to keep the good vibes going at all times. Chuck Cunningham Syndrome: She has strangely
been left out of Space. She's also always absent in the trailers, with the reason of her lack of appearances unknown. Bonus points for being put on a nest. Clucking Funny: Well, more like one. She's actually a chicken. Death from Above: By dropping an
exploding egg, launching herself upward at an angle. Granola Girl: She is depicted as this type of character in the movie. Lady Not Appearing In This Trailer: She never appears in any Angry Birds video trailer, and her only prominent appearance was in a Chinese cross promotion for Coca Cola and the summer Olympic games. Lethal Chef: While she
can cooks just fine, her cooking in Cordon Bleugh! episode in Toons is deeply loathed by the other birds, and is so terrible that it can kill plants. Made of Iron: Able to survive having a giant boulder thrown at him and being blown up with dynamite in "Gardening with Terence". Mighty Glacier: He travels
slowly when defying gravity. This makes up for his very hard-hitting brute force. Averted in Toons, he teleports. Noodle Incident: In The Angry Birds Movie, what Terence did to get assigned to anger management class is never made clear. We just see Matilda staring at him in gobsmacked horror, whilst the background music changes to police
sirens... and screaming women. We get another hint when Matilda learns that Terence is driving their getaway truck, she advises everyone to buckle up and emphasizes this with a "Trust me!" This implies that part of the reason was that he Drives Like Crazy. No Social Skills: Keeps himself apart from the other birds and finds it hard to socialize with
them. Not So Stoic: He does crack a tiny smile on rare occasions, usually at the end of an episode. More significantly, an early promotional poster() shows him cowering in fear before the Mighty Eagle. Lightning Bruiser: Of the Pintsized Powerhouse variety. He's fast (somewhere between Red's normal speed and Chuck's fast speed), packs a surprising punch for his
size (he can easily smash through wood and ice), and his ballooning ability can cause a lot of damage if used properly. Perpetual Smiler: His default expression is a cheerful smile (or as close to one as a beak can get). "Pop!" Goes the Human: In Angry Birds 2, he bursts instead of deflating, dealing a small level of knockback to anything close enough
Sweet Tooth: Every trailer he's been in involves him eating candy. In the games, he doesn't appear until a candy level is released. His only appearances in Angry Birds Toons are the Halloween episodes. Tagalong Kid: He joined the flock late in the series, and mostly just comes along when there's candy involved. Tempting Fate: In the second
Halloween special, he ate the candy that turns anyone into a kraken monster.
